Outreach:

Conference Attendance:

- ✓ Enroll America's State of Enrollment Conference, Washington, D.C., June 10-12
 - Networked and learned from other "navigators", was reminded of how great Kentucky is, and simultaneously learned more about how great immigrant access and campaigns to increase immigrant access is in other states, i.e. California.

Effective Partnerships:

- ✓ Kentucky Voices for Health: recording and sharing stories of successful and unsuccessful enrollments and disparities. Example: Woman from Cote d'Ivoire who has been a permanent resident (green-card holder) for two years, so is ineligible for Medicaid, even though she is under the Medicaid income limit and is also pregnant and needing affordable prenatal care. She already used the limited Presumptive Eligibility Medicaid available to her.

Forecasts

- Continue to record and share stories about successful/unsuccessful enrollments and challenging enrollment experiences. Share these stories with the Kentucky Health Benefit Exchange, Kentucky Voices for Health, and other partners.
- Continue to debunk myths about immigrant eligibility for coverage under the Affordable Care Act! -As well as eligibility for federally-funded health assistance programs (Time-Limited Medicaid, DSH) and local assistance programs and resources.
- Continue to develop relationships with area churches with Spanish-speaking groups. Increase outreach to the families involved in the justice system. Continue to develop western Kentucky outreach through Migrant Education Programs and churches.
